



THE NEW YORK TIMES BETRAYED JULIAN ASSANGE!

New revelations expose how **The New York Times** set up **Julian Assange** to take the fall. **The NY Times** and the **Guardian** betrayed **Julian Assange**. **Mark Davis**, an award-winning Australian investigative journalist, shows how both **The NY Times** and the **Guardian** have smeared **Assange**, while using him to cover up their own actions in the publication of the **Afghan War Logs**.

Davis refutes the claims by both **The NY Times** and the **Guardian** that **Assange** was their source and they, journalists. Both **The NY Times** and the **Guardian** were intent upon setting up **Assange** from the start, insisting that **WikiLeaks** publish first. But there were technical difficulties that prevented the site from publishing first. **The NY Times** and the **Guardian**, having announced the publication of the **War Logs**, were forced to do so in advance of **WikiLeaks**. They continue in the lie that **WikiLeaks** had published first. **Davis** makes the compelling case that since **The NY Times** and the **Guardian** published first, they shouldn't be spared from the charges being put forth by the Trump administration's justice department against **Assange**. *"If Julian's in jail, they should be as well."*

The NY Times co-published the Afghanistan and Iraq War Logs in 2010, in collaboration with **WikiLeaks**. It partnered with **WikiLeaks** again in publishing the **Collateral Murder** video which exposed the crimes committed against innocent civilians, intentionally killing children and journalists in our name and with our tax dollars. **TNYT** journalists who worked with **Assange**, including Mark Mazzetti, Jane Perlez, Eric Schmitt, Andrew W. Lehren, C. J. Chivers, Carlotta Gall, Jacob Harris, Alan McLean, are now in the crosshairs.

Rather than defend **Julian Assange**, **The NY Times** became a vehicle for the dissemination of baseless attacks on **Assange**, attempts to destroy him, and threatening all whistleblowers and publishers of the truth.
